You need to be part ant, part bat, and part fish if you want to explore the Huautla cave system in Mexico. Explorers have to be prepared to spend weeks at a time in the dark, damp caves, sometimes as much as a mile underground! They also have to haul 60-pound packs down shafts that can be as deep as a 36-story building. When they come to passageways that are flooded with water, explorers use special scuba gear to keep going. Can you imagine diving into a dark, underground river with no idea how far it will be to the next dry part of the cave? This special scuba gear lets explorers stay submerged for up to 16 hours—just in case!
